DISASTER/EMERGENCY PLAN FORMAT

- 1. HAVE 'TO-DO' LISTS FOR EVACUATION IN EVERY LIKELY DISASTER:
 FIRE, FLOOD, EARTHQUAKE, ETC.
- 2. SELECT A PLACE WHERE YOU WILL MEET AFTERWARDS
- 3. SET 'OUT OF AREA" PHONE CONTACT TO KEEP ALL INFORMED
- 4. CHECK 'OUT OF THE AREA' MOTELS FOR PET POLICIES
- 5. CHECK WITH RELATIVES AND FRIENDS FOR A PLACE TO STAY IF
 YOU MUST EVACUATE
- 6. CHECK WITH NEIGHBORS ABOUT TAKING CARE OF ANIMALS IF YOU ARE NOT HOME DURING A DISASTER
 - MAKE SURE THEY HAVE A KEY
 - A CONTACT NUMBER 'OUT OF THE AREA'
 - SHOW THEM YOUR ANIMAL DISASTER SUPPLY LOCATION
- 7. KEEP AN UP-TO-DATE LIST OF I.C.E. (IN-CASE-OF-EMERGENCY)

 PHONE NUMBERS WITH YOU AND FAMILY MEMBERS AT ALL TIMES
- 8. EVERYONE SHOULD HAVE AN EMERGENCY BATTERY-POWERED OR CRANK-STYLE RADIO WITH THEM AT ALL TIMES
- 9. ALL BELONGINGS SHOULD BE MARKED WITH YOUR NAME AND NUMBER INCLUDING YOUR ANIMAL
- 10. EVERYONE SHOULD HAVE A FIRST AID KIT WITH THEM
- 11. COLLECT YOUR EMERGENCY SUPPLIES AND CHECK THEM OFTEN
- 12. HAVE CAGES, LEASHES AND COLLARS FOR ALL YOUR ANIMALS & PHOTOS READY TO GO WITH YOU
- 13. SELECT A 'SHELTER IN PLACE' AREA AT HOME AND SET IN
 SUPPLIES FOR 1-2 DAY STAY

OUT OF AREA CONTACT (O.O.A.C)

In an emergency, local calls have low priority, so have an out of area code contact for all family members

- 2. MAKE SURE THE O.O.A.C. HAS EVERYONE'S CELL AND LAND LINE NUMBERS.

 THEY ARE LOOKING FOR ONCE ENTRY IS OBTAINED
- 6. WARN FIRST RESPONDERS REGARDING HOW THE ANIMALS
 MIGHT ACT IN THE PRESENCE OF STRANGERS
- 7. HAVE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOU AND FAMILY
 MEMBERS DON'T FORGET THE PICTURES

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SHELTERING IN PLACE*

- 1. IF YOU SMELL A STRANGE, STRONG ODOR COMING IN FROM THE WINDOWS, GET EVERYONE INSIDE
- 2. CLOSE THE WINDOWS AND DOORS INCLUDING THE FIREPLACE
 DAMPER
- 3. TURN OFF THE A.C. OR HEAT AND ALL FANS
- 4. COVER MOUTH WITH CLOTH MASK
- 5. SELECT A SMALL WINDOWLESS AREA THAT YOU CAN SEAL FROM
 OUTSIDE AIR; CLOSETS, SMALL BATHROOMS OR CRAWL SPACE
 MAKE GOOD CHOICES
- 6. HAVE YOUR SHELTER IN PLACE KIT IN THE AREA GET EVERYONE INSIDE INCLUDING PETS
 - · MASKS
 - · PLASTIC SHEETING
 - · PLASTIC GLOVES, TOWELS
 - READING MATERIAL
 - SNACKS FOR KIDS
 - SEALED WATER BOTTLES
 - CELL PHONE AND I.C.E. NUMBERS
- 7. USE PLASTIC BAGS OR PLASTIC TARP TO SEAL YOU INSIDE
- 8. BRING YOUR RADIO INSIDE WITH YOU
- 9. LISTEN FOR AN "ALL CLEAR" MESSAGE BEFORE YOU COME OUT
- 10. AIR OUT YOUR HOUSE BEFORE YOU REMOVE YOUR MASK
